GARFIELD MEMORIAL TABLET.—This afternoon a very fine piece of work was set in place in the ladies' room of the Baltimore and Potomac depot. It is a memorial stone to mark the place where President Garfield was shot, and is set in the wall directly over the silver star in the floor, which marks the place where the President fell. The tablet is of white marble, about 3 by 4 feet superficies, and is an elegant piece of carving. An eagle surmounts the work, holding in its claws arrows and laurels, and beneath it the American flag falls gracefully about a tablet in gold letters inscribed: "James Abram Garfield, President of the United States, shot July 2, 1881."
